⁴ STAT 220, 221 or STAT 311 are also acceptable substitutes for statistics. Statistical Methods or equivalent must be complete by the end of the quarter of application. Effective autumn 2019, STAT 220 & 221 will no longer be acceptable alternatives.

⁵ Must be completed at the time of application. For English courses, choose from among C LIT 240, ENGL 109, ENGL 110, ENGL 111, ENGL 121, ENGL 131, ENGL 197, ENGL 198, ENGL 199, ENGL 281, ENGL 297, 298, 299 or equivalent.
