



INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT





Our advisors assist international students in navigating university policy and resources as they relate to the visa benefits and restrictions. ISS adheres to federal reporting requirements to ensure University and student compliance with all federal regulations in order to maintain the University's ability to enroll international students in degree programs on the Seattle campus. Some of the Student Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS) reporting requirements include quarterly enrollment verification for all enrolled international students, updating academic majors/minors, address changes, travel authorization, employment or internship authorization, drop below fulltime status or final quarter below fulltime authorization, change of degree program, and Optional Practical Training authorization.

ISS collaborates with UW campus partners such as the admission offices, FIUTS, First Year Programs, Student Life, Counseling, Office of the University Registrar, academic advisors, Housing & Food Services, Payroll & Student Fiscal Services, and Career Services to provide coordinated services and support for enrolled international students.
