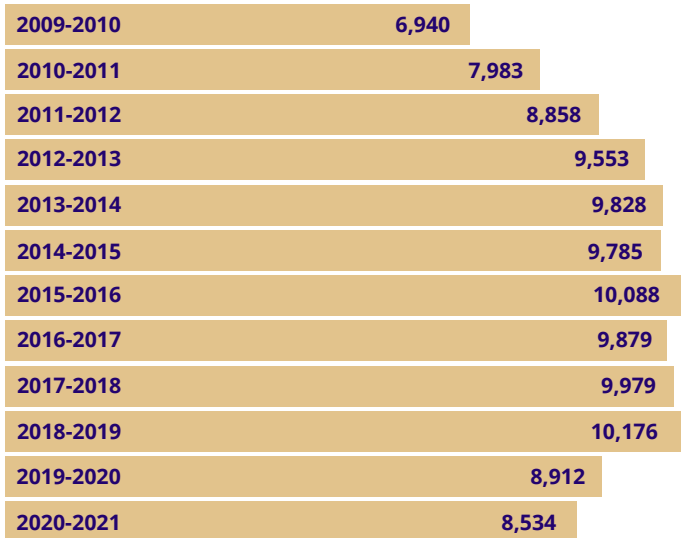

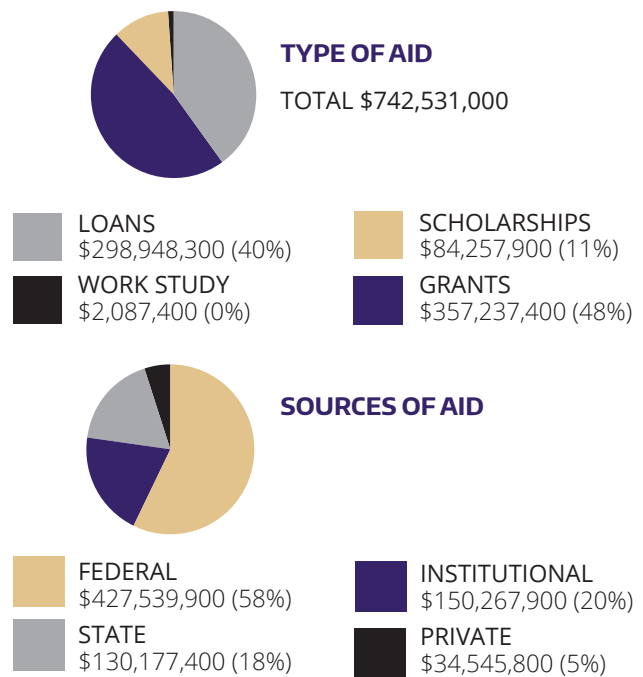

## VETERANS EDUCATION BENEFITS OFFICE (VEBO) 2020-2021

VEBO administers five VA educational benefit programs and three state waiver programs for veterans and dependents. VEBO also provides financial aid counseling to veterans, dependents and active duty service members.

**1,002** students at UW Seattle indicated they were veterans, active duty, reserves or guard members

>> **68%** utilized some form of VA educational resource

**2,616** students indicated they were dependents of veterans or active duty service members

>> **597** dependents utilized VA educational benefits

**3,124** original certifications were performed by VEBO, resulting in **\$13+ million** in tuition payments received at UW Seattle
