




Seattle - Transfer Admits by Institution Type Autumn 2016-2020



> Transfers



- The transfer class includes a record number of underrepresented students.
- Admission as a transfer applicant from a Washington CC is still accessible with an overall admit rate of 68%.




Bothell - Transfer Admits by Institution Type Autumn 2016-2020



- Overall quality of applications is up significantly, resulting in a higher admit rate.
- Largest freshman class in Bothell's history.
- Overlap with Seattle increased to 75% from 67% in Fall 2018.
 - \circ 4% yield on students admitted to both
 - o Increased communication/collaboration between admission offices

> **Transfers**


- Resident Transfer applications were up in 2020 after multiple years of declining applications.
- The absolute number of non-residents was flat, decreasing on a percentage basis.




Tacoma - Freshman Admits by Residency







Tacoma - Transfer Admits by Institution Type Autumn 2016-2020



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



- In comparison to 2019, 2020 was down a bit for both freshmen and transfer applications, admits, confirmations and registered.
- UWT attracts a significant number of BIPOC and lower-income students—populations disproportionately impacted by the pandemic. Our admission recruiters have been very aggressive in outreach efforts, but the response to their virtual programming has been largely uneven (as evidenced by the drop in applications).
- Two growth areas for UWT: programs in the School of Engineering Technology, and Biomedical Sciences.
- We expect a reverse in this admission application trend for next year as we're finishing the implementation of Slate CRM.
- UWT's overall student enrollment is up in comparison to a year ago.
